During the last six months of 2021, we, our patients and healthcare professionals across the country continued to face many challenges as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The steadfast support from our volunteers, Board of Directors, Scientific and Nurse Advisory Boards, our Patient and Family Caregiver Committee and funders and donors, have enabled us to continue to drive forward our mission to empower the lymphoma and CLL community across Canada. OUR MISSION

Empower patients and the lymphoma community through education, support, advocacy and research

2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS (JUN-DEC)

EDUCATION

- Hosted remaining educational sessions for a total of 10 webinars and 5 educational forums, with over 2300 registrants, on topics of interest including Fear of Recurrence, Importance of Understanding your Lymphoma Subtype, Canadian Clinical Trials, Oral Complications from Treatment and Watch & Wait for lymphoma/CLL
- Hosted the National Conference (Oct 14-15) and French Conference (Nov 12)
- Shipped over 3000 Patient Resource Manuals on NHL, CLL and HL, along with other printed resources in 2021
- Released 14 subtype fact sheets and launched an informational campaign on the Importance of Understanding your Lymphoma Subtype
- Developed a Side Effect Fact Sheet (pending SAB review)
- Updates to existing resources and webpages, alongside the French Patient Resource Manuals

SUPPORT

- Released the Lymphoma & CLL Patient and Caregiver COVID-19
 Experience Report
- Provide ongoing one-on-one information and support to patients and caregivers through direct contact and via support groups including the SouthWestern Ontario Chapter and Wellspring Westerkirk Support Group

ADVOCACY



- Re-launched a Molecular Testing Information Campaign for CLL patients
- Advocated for lymphoma patient and caregiver access to the COVID-19 vaccines via Scientific Advisory Board letters of support to government; participated in Global News campaign thereon with other patient organizations
- Launched on Macleans.ca and l'Actualité.ca a three-story advocacy campaign on lymphoma and CLL, sharing patient's stories of hope and courage and highlighting the importance of the caregiver-patient relationship
- Continued advocacy for equitable access to CAR T-cell treatment for DLBCL patients across provinces in collaboration with other organizations
- Shared patient feedback in 100% of CADTH/INESSS lymphoma/CLL therapy submissions for a total of 9 submissions to facilitate access to new and innovative therapies in Canada
- Advocacy efforts targeting accessing specific lymphoma therapies that have either received negative funding recommendations or where there are provincial funding delays (i.e. Extracorporeal Photophoresis in Maritime provinces)
- Release of a National Treatment Guideline for Diffuse Large B-Cell
 Lymphoma in the frontline and relapsed/refractory setting



Awarded two Canadian researchers in their work to improve outcomes related to lymphoproliferative malignancies

Dr. Krysta Coyle Simon Fraser University, British Columbia

Dr. Coyle's research focuses on the effect of specific molecular mutations in mantle cell lymphoma to test a new treatment in this lymphoma subtype.

Dr. Versha Banerji University of Manitoba, Manitoba

Dr. Banerji's research focuses on the feasibility and implementation of therapies for chronic lymphocytic leukemia within the healthcare system to improve access.
