Patient Resource Manuals




In 2024, Lymphoma Canada distributed nearly 6,000 educational resources free of charge to patients, hospitals, and cancer centres across the country. These vital materials — including our **Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma (NHL)**, **Hodgkin Lymphoma (HL)**, and **Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia (CLL)** patient manuals — are often the first source of education for newly diagnosed individuals, helping them better understand their diagnosis and treatment options. We also provide these resources directly to patients through one-on-one requests via our website and info@lymphoma.ca email, ensuring accessible, personalized support nationwide.

DID YOU KNOW ...

While nearly 6,000 printed resources were distributed free of charge to patients and hospitals across Canada, more than 12,100 individuals accessed and downloaded digital versions of our English and French patient materials - ensuring critical information reached those who needed it most, in both official languages.

Webinar Series

Lymphoma Canada's 2024 webinar series reached and engaged over 1,500 registrants, offering accessible, expert-led education on a wide range of topics relevant to the lymphoma and CLL community. Throughout the year, sessions provided valuable updates on the latest advancements in lymphoma and CLL care, including highlights from the 2023 American Society of Hematology (ASH) Conference, evolving treatment options for B-cell and T-cell lymphomas, and the availability of CAR-T cell therapy in Manitoba. The series also addressed essential aspects of patient well-being, with webinars on mental health and wellness, mindfulness and stress reduction, and managing symptoms and side effects. Topics such as supportive and palliative care, and clinical trials for lymphoma and CLL patients further expanded the program's relevance and reach. By combining clinical insight with a focus on quality of life, this series continues to support and inform patients and caregivers across the country.

New Patient Resources Released in 2024

In 2024, Lymphoma Canada released four new educational resources designed to address key challenges faced by lymphoma and CLL patients throughout their treatment and care journey. These included factsheets on **Cytokine Release Syndrome (CRS)** and **Immune Effector Cell-Associated Neurotoxicity Syndrome (ICANS)** - two potential side effects of advanced therapies such as CAR-T cell therapy and bi-specific antibodies. Each factsheet offers clear, accessible information to help patients and caregivers recognize symptoms early and seek appropriate care. Additionally, we introduced a **Coping with Fatigue guide**, providing practical strategies to manage one of the most common and persistent side effects of lymphoma and its treatments, and a new resource focused on **End-of-Life Care**, offering compassionate guidance and support for patients and families navigating this deeply personal stage of the cancer experience. Together, these resources reflect our continued commitment to providing trusted, patient-centered information at every stage of the lymphoma journey.

8th Annual National Conference for Lymphoma and CLL Patients

Lymphoma Canada hosted its 8th Annual National Conference for Lymphoma and CLL patients virtually from October 16th to 18th, 2024, with over 650 registrants, making it the most well-attended conference to date. The conference was chaired by Dr. David MacDonald, a hematologist from the Ottawa Hospital and member of Lymphoma Canada's Scientific Advisory Board, and featured a comprehensive three-day program designed to educate and empower patients and caregivers.

Day 1 featured key sessions such as "Lymphoma 101 for Newly Diagnosed Patients", an in-depth discussion on "Lymphoma in the Adolescent and Young Adult (AYA) Population", and an exploration of "Targeted and Cellular Therapies." Day 2 explored various lymphoma subtypes, offering breakout sessions on specific topics such as Diffuse Large B-Cell Lymphoma (DLBCL), CLL/SLL, and Hodgkin Lymphoma, presented by renowned experts in the field. The day concluded with

Q&A sessions, allowing attendees to directly engage with the speakers. On Day 3, the focus shifted to health and wellness, with a panel on "Multidisciplinary Management of Lymphoma and CLL," along with sessions covering spiritual health, sleep management, and exercise specifically tailored for lymphoma and CLL patients.

The virtual format provided broad accessibility, enabling participants from across Canada to gain valuable insights, furthering Lymphoma Canada's commitment to providing high-quality education and support for those affected by lymphoma and CLL.

Lymphoma Links Peer-Mentorship Program

In 2024, Lymphoma Canada continued to address the needs of patients and caregivers by facilitating connections through the Lymphoma Links Peer-to-Peer Mentorship Program. Many individuals express the desire to connect with others who have gone through similar experiences, and this program offers a valuable opportunity for that. Patients and caregivers can either seek support as mentees or offer their guidance as mentors, sharing their personal experiences with lymphoma to help others navigate their journey. Ask a Lymphoma/CLL Specialist Q&A Program

In 2024, Lymphoma Canada launched the Ask a Lymphoma/CLL Specialist Q&A Program, offering patients a unique opportunity to have their questions answered by top experts in the field of lymphoma and CLL, empowering them with the knowledge needed to make informed decisions about their care. The first session, held on September 4th, featured Dr. John Kuruvilla, a renowned hematologist at the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre. The second session, on November 29th, welcomed Dr. David MacDonald, a distinguished specialist from The Ottawa Hospital. By facilitating direct access to these experts, Lymphoma Canada is bridging the gap between medical expertise and patient support, ensuring that patients receive reliable, timely information to navigate their lymphoma journey.

Patient Testimonial From the Inaugural Ask a Lymphoma/CLL Q&A Program

"I was diagnosed with CLL only three months ago, so my understanding of this illness is very limited. I attended the most recent webinar "Ask a Lymphoma / CLL Specialist", and I submitted a question in advance of this session, and my question was addressed during the session. I have not had any physical CLL symptoms that are evident to me other than my blood tests. However, a month ago I began having marked swelling in one foot and lower leg which continued, and I wondered if this might be a CLL symptom. I posed that question through the webinar, and Dr. John Kuruvilla said that while the swelling might be a CLL symptom, he recommended I ask my primary care provider about having an ultrasound to determine if I might have a blood clot. While I have never had a blood clot, within two days of the webinar, and on the advice of Doctor John, I saw my family doctor, had an ultrasound, received the results identifying that I did have a blood clot, and I began taking the prescribed blood thinner. When I next connect with my hematologist in November, I will ask him if this blood clot and resultant swelling were caused by the CLL. Please extend my most sincere thanks to Doctor John for responding to my question and providing his advice."

Lymphoma Canada is dedicated to enhancing outcomes for lymphoma patients by advocating for equitable access to cutting-edge therapies nationwide. We firmly believe that every individual diagnosed with lymphoma deserves access to the necessary care and treatments for their well-being regardless of the province in which they may reside.



Advocacy and Partnerships for Improved Access to Treatment

In 2024, Lymphoma Canada partnered with CLL Canada to support a letter to the pan-Canadian Pharmaceutical Alliance (pCPA) advocating for the reimbursement of Ibrutinib with Venetoclax (I+V) for the treatment of adult patients with previously untreated chronic lymphocytic leukemia (CLL). The letter emphasized the need for equitable access to effective treatments, particularly for high-risk patients and those facing logistical barriers. It also highlighted that I+V aligns with patient preferences for time-limited therapies and could reduce overall treatment costs while improving access to care.

Additionally, Lymphoma Canada collaborated with the Lymphoma Coalition to gain deeper insights into the patient and caregiver

experience through a global survey. With over 700 responses from Canadian participants, Lymphoma Canada will publish reports in early 2025 that summarize patient and caregiver experiences and provide insights into various lymphoma subtypes, including CLL, DLBCL, and others. This data will further support our advocacy efforts and drive meaningful change in the lymphoma care landscape.

Canadian Drug Association (CDA) & Institut national d'excellence en santé et en services sociaux (INESSS) Submissions

Lymphoma Canada remains committed to advocating for patients by sharing their experiences with new therapies. In Canada, Health Canada oversees the approval of lymphoma treatments at the federal level, while two key organizations— the Institut national d'excellence en santé et en services sociaux (INESSS) for Quebec residents and the Canadian Drug Association for the rest of the country—review novel therapies based on clinical, economic, and patient perspectives. Lymphoma Canada plays a pivotal role in this process by conducting and promoting patient experience surveys for all lymphoma treatments under consideration by the CDA and INESSS. These surveys, distributed through our national email list, provide invaluable insights that help decision-makers assess which therapies to fund. By amplifying the patient's voice, Lymphoma Canada ensures that the needs and experiences of those affected by lymphoma are considered in the treatment approval process. Over our history, Lymphoma Canada has awarded millions of dollars in research grants and fellowships. We are proud of our contributions to the research community and projects, the results of which have improved health systems, and health outcomes for lymphoma patients in Canada.

2024 Research Grants

Lymphoma Canada's research funding is dedicated to supporting well-defined research studies with the potential to bring about improvements in healthcare, health systems, and health outcomes, specifically in the area of malignant lymphoproliferative diseases. In 2024, the research grant recipients were Dr. Robert Vanner and Dr. Rob Laister for their research project, "Somatic Mutation as a Novel Determinant of CAR-T Outcome in Lymphoma." This project aims to explore how somatic mutations could influence the effectiveness of CAR-T cell therapy, potentially leading to better patient outcomes in the treatment of lymphoma.


Lymphoma Patients Sharing Their Stories to Underscore the Importance of Research

Through the courage and openness of Mika and Kesley, two individuals whose lives have been profoundly impacted by lymphoma, we were able to shed light on the need for sustained research funding. Their powerful stories not only raised awareness for but also underscored the transformative potential of research to improve both the quality of patient care and long-term outcomes. Their journeys have highlighted that with continued investment in research, there is hope for a future where more treatment options are available to lymphoma patients.



Raising Awareness for Rare Lymphoma Subtypes

Lymphoma Canada launched a Rare Diseases Awareness Campaign in December 2024 to spotlight the challenges faced by patients with less common forms of lymphoma. While lymphoma is the most common type of blood cancer, it includes over 80 distinct subtypes—some of which are considered rare and can be difficult to diagnose due to their atypical symptoms. This campaign aimed to raise awareness among both the public and healthcare providers to promote earlier recognition and diagnosis of these rare forms. Highlighted subtypes included cutaneous T-cell lymphoma (CTCL), Epstein-Barr virus (EBV)-associated lymphoma, peripheral T-cell lymphoma (PTCL), extranodal NK/T-cell lymphoma (nasal type), and central nervous system (CNS) lymphoma. By increasing visibility and understanding of these rare lymphomas, Lymphoma Canada continues to advocate for improved patient outcomes and timely access to care.



Spotlight: Dr. John Kuruvilla - Chair, Lymphoma Canada Scientific Advisory Board


Dr. John Kuruvilla is a distinguished leader in the field of hematologic oncology and serves as Chair of Lymphoma Canada's Scientific Advisory Board. He is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto and a hematologist within the Division of Medical Oncology and Hematology at the Princess Margaret Cancer Centre. At Princess Margaret, Dr. Kuruvilla holds several key leadership roles, including Lymphoma/Myeloma Disease Site Group Lead and Co-Director of the High-Definition Therapeutics Strategic Pillar - an initiative focused on advancing precision medicine in cancer care.

Dr. Kuruvilla's research focuses on developing innovative treatments for lymphoid malignancies, with a strong emphasis on integrating scientific discovery into clinical applications. His efforts contribute directly to expanding treatment options and improving care for patients with both Hodgkin and non-Hodgkin lymphoma. In his national role as Lymphoma Co-Chair for the Canadian Cancer Trials Group (CCTG), he helps shape and oversee collaborative clinical trials that influence standards of care across the country.

A passionate advocate for the lymphoma community, Dr. Kuruvilla is also a frequent speaker at national and international conferences and actively contributes to educational initiatives for newly diagnosed patients, survivors, and caregivers. As Chair of Lymphoma Canada's Scientific Advisory Board, Dr. Kuruvilla leads a multidisciplinary team that sets research priorities, reviews funding proposals, and supports the creation of trusted, evidence-based educational resources. His clinical expertise and leadership ensure that the organization's work remains grounded in both scientific rigor and the real-world needs of patients and caregivers.

For Lymphoma Canada, Dr. Kuruvilla is always ready to respond to any questions our team may have for him, and consistently provides insightful suggestions and guidance on strategic and everyday work that we do. Our patient programs are impactful largely due to the unrelenting support of Dr. Kuruvilla.

We are proud to recognize Dr. Kuruvilla's continued contributions and leadership, which strengthen Lymphoma Canada's impact and help drive meaningful progress for all Canadians affected by lymphoma and CLL.

Kelsey's Journey of Strength: Overcoming Lymphoma With Hope and Resilience



Imagine waking up one day unable to move your legs. For Kelsey, a young gymnastics coach, this was her reality in the summer of 2020. After months of rib pain, Kelsey suddenly lost the ability to walk. An emergency spinal surgery revealed the cause: Hodgkin's Lymphoma- nodular sclerosis, a cancer that had silently grown, compressing her spine.

Kelsey's battle included 12 rounds of intense chemotherapy. The treatment left her battling severe nausea and side effects, but she remained determined. Yoga and maintaining a routine were essential in helping her stay grounded and focused. "Staying active and finding joy in small things helped me cope," says Kelsey.

Lymphoma Canada provided the support and information Kelsey needed during her treatment, offering guidance and a sense of community. Now, four years cancer-free, Kelsey has graduated from a healthcare program and works to help others in their own health journeys.

Kelsey's story reminds us of the power of early diagnosis, effective treatments, and the ongoing need for research. With your help, Lymphoma Canada can continue supporting patients like Kelsey, providing resources, information, and hope for a brighter future.


