## EDUCATION

- As part of our ongoing commitment to support and inform patients and caregivers, we offered the following educational sessions in the first half of 2025: Update from the 2024 American Society of Hematology (ASH) Conference, Understanding Therapy Coverage: A Pathway to Better Care, Nutrition and Wellness, Watch and Wait for Lymphoma and CLL Patients, Diffuse Large B-Cell Lymphoma: Treatment Options in Canada
- We have disseminated, free of charge, over 4,749 resources to date in 2025
- We are happy to have added 5 new cancer centers in Canada to our distribution list
- Hosted 2 quarterly Ask a Lymphoma/CLL Specialist Q&A Sessions featuring Dr. Carolyn Owen and Dr. Pamela Skrabek

# SUPPORT

- Lymphoma Canada, in collaboration with Wellspring, continue to facilitate monthly support groups (virtual) for lymphoma patients.
- We provide ongoing, one-on-one information and support to patients and caregivers through direct contact (phone and email) as well through our Lymphoma Links Peer Mentorship Program.

## **ADVOCACY**



- Participated in all patient submission opportunities with respect to lymphoma and CLL therapies to the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health (CADTH) and the Quebec equivalent, INESSS.
- Lymphoma Canada is currently in the process of updating our White Paper: Access to Innovative Therapies in Canada. This important report examines the evolving landscape of treatment access for patients with lymphoma and CLL, highlighting challenges, provincial variations, and opportunities to improve timely availability of novel therapies in Canada.
- ❖ At Lymphoma Canada, we fund research that drives meaningful change for people affected by lymphoma and CLL. Our grants support studies that improve patient outcomes, healthcare delivery, and system-level decision-making, including work on patient-reported outcomes, comparative effectiveness, pharmacoeconomics, and healthcare utilization. Through our Research Impact Spotlight Campaign, we highlight these projects and their positive impact, advocating for better care and stronger health systems for lymphoma and CLL patients across Canada.



We received several excellent research award applications in 2025. The 2025 Lymphoma Canada Research Award Review Committee has completed its analysis of applicants and related projects. Our announcement with respect to successful applicants will be released in September 2025. We would like to thank and acknowledge all applicants for their well thought out submissions.
